- transmission of humanitarian values
- social justice standards (e.g. activism)
- importance of
 - > teach: more adjectives, "some" people, politeness
 - relevant pictures
 - no overgeneralizing
 - > thinking about routines, not the textbook

Reading & writing

- not acquired naturally
- reading: scaffolding for children learning to write
- biliteracy: reading & writing; no negative influence on L1 development
- importance of
 - starting with reading comprehension (usually silent)
 - moving on to reading aloud activities

Martin Bastkowski

Assessment & transition to secondary school

- > teacher's role: teach & assess
- important: variety of assessment tasks
- > transition
 - cooperation: teachers, students, parents
 - transition checklist
 - content awareness

Anja Steinlen & Thorsten Piske

Bilingual education

- goals: biliteracy and bilingualism
- > 4 conditions:
 - > 1. early start
 - > 2. continuous and intensive exposure
 - > 3. frequent use
 - > 4. authentic and enriched input
- CLIL: 4 dimensions (content, cognition, communication, culture) (Coyle 2005)

Stephen Krashen

Fiction

- people like fiction and stories, talk about cool films
- key to acquisition: understanding good stories
- importance of
 - > self-selected stories
 - comprehensible input (stories!)
 - fiction (beats non-fiction!)
- language class = storytime!
