Please read the assigned text. Assess the major arguments of the text. (15 mins)

In your group, collect overlapping ideas of Walcott's critical stance on literature and postcolonialism. Save your results. (15 mins)

Group 2

- Person 1: Anthony Milne, "Dereck Wallcott" (1982)
- Person 2: Edward Hirsch, "The Art of Poetry" (1986)

Please read the assigned text. Assess the main topics the interviewers raise in the interviews. 20 mins)

In your pair, collect overlapping ideas of Walcott's writing and his own response to these preoccupations. Save your results. (10 mins)
