

- Werden die Vorgaben zur Behebung oder Abwendung der Gefährdung einer Stätte erfolgreich umgesetzt und wird sie als nicht mehr bedroht angesehen, kann das Welterbekomitee die Streichung einer Stätte von der Liste des gefährdeten Erbes der Welt entscheiden, so geschehen beispielsweise im Falle des Kölner Doms 2006

World Heritage List -> List of World Heritage in Danger?

- World Heritage List (OUV)
- -> Periodic Reporting
- anticipate potential hazards, to mitigate associated risks, and to act before a property becomes seriously threatened
- -> Reactive Reporting
- state of conservation of specific World Heritage properties that are under threat
- Addition to the List of World Heritage in Danger
- OUV lost -> deletion from the World Heritage List



Compendium II: ICOMOS World Heritage in Danger

- **World Heritage in Danger - UNESCO World Heritage Centre (Link zum Bericht)**

- A compendium of key decisions on the conservation of cultural heritage properties on the UNESCO List of World Heritage in Danger
- Original: The analysis identified eight major categories of threats, which were further subdivided into sub-categories. The threats included deterioration due to human or natural sources, development pressures caused by demographic growth or uncontrolled commercial or agricultural developments, the extraction of natural resources (such as oil, gas, water, timber), large-scale development projects, aggressive and/or unsustainable tourism due to lack of adequate visitor management, and general management deficiencies, often due to lack of resources and lack of clarity in the definition of the property and its boundaries. A frequent cause of problems were social or cultural changes in and around the heritage property, and deficiencies in the appreciation of its OUV, resulting in the loss of the attributes defining its authenticity and/or integrity. Finally, threats could be caused due to the weakness of the socio-economic situation and governance in the country, the lack of properly trained personnel, and the failure to apply relevant legal measures for the protection of heritage properties.

- Acht Hauptkategorien von Bedrohungen:
- 1. Zu den Bedrohungen gehörten Verschlechterungen durch menschliche oder natürliche Faktoren,
- 2. Entwicklungsdruck durch demographisches Wachstum oder unkontrollierte kommerzielle oder landwirtschaftliche Entwicklungen, die Gewinnung natürlicher Ressourcen (wie Öl, Gas, Wasser, Holz),
- 3. große Entwicklungsprojekte, 4. aggressiver und/oder nicht nachhaltiger Tourismus aufgrund mangelnder angemessener Besucherführung und Management
- 5. allgemeine Managementmängel, oft aufgrund von Ressourcenmangel und mangelnder Klarheit bei der Definition des Grundstücks und seiner Grenzen.
- 6. Eine häufige Ursache für Probleme waren soziale oder kulturelle Veränderungen in und um das Kulturerbe,
- 7. und Mängel bei der Beurteilung seines OUV, was zum Verlust der Attribute führt, die seine Authentizität und/oder Integrität definieren.
- 8. Schließlich könnten Bedrohungen aufgrund der schwachen sozioökonomischen Situation und Governance im Land, des Mangels an gut ausgebildetem Personal und der Nichtanwendung einschlägiger rechtlicher Maßnahmen zum Schutz von Kulturgütern entstehen.





Glasgow School of Art Fire 2014 – Funding for Restoration and Renovation

- GSA estimates the cost of restoring the building to be between £20m and £35m.
- The blaze, which destroyed about 10% of the building, including the Mackintosh library, broke out on Friday 23 May
- The initiative attracted a £750,000 contribution from the Scottish government, which has also pledged £5m in match funding towards the restoration costs. The UK government has also said it will make a contribution.

- A third of the Mackintosh, including its library, suffered significant damage in a previous fire four years ago and the building was undergoing a £35m renovation.
- “We should resist the calls to rebuild it as before stone by stone. That would not be restoration, it would be replication, a process I believe Mackintosh himself would resist as he was an innovator not a copyist,” he said.

- Mércio Gomes, an anthropologist and former president of Brazil's indigenous agency, Fundação Nacional do Índio (FUNAI), compared the loss to the burning of the library of Alexandria in 48BC. "We Brazilians only have 500 years of history. Our National Museum was 200 years old, but that's what we had, and what is lost forever," he wrote on Facebook. "We have to reconstruct our National Museum."
- Duart also said that the museum had just closed a deal with the Brazilian government's development bank, BNDES, for funds that included a fire prevention project. "This is the most terrible irony," he said.





A national campaign under the banner "Save Syria's History" was launched to raise awareness on the current looting of museums and legal excavation of archaeological sites. It also serves to remind all Syrian people of the importance of protecting their rich cultural heritage for the benefit of future generations.

Archaeological sites

Legal excavations and looting have exponentially increased since the beginning of the conflict in Syria. These actions have damaged many historical sites and museums, and most Syrian cultural property has disappeared into the clandestine markets on the black market and/or in private collections.

UN Resolutions

The United Nations Security Council, on 12 February 2015, adopted the Resolution 2199 that condemns the destruction of cultural heritage and adopts legally-binding measures to counter illicit trafficking of antiquities and cultural objects from Iraq and Syria.



Between 6 December 2011 (top) and 14 July 2014 (middle), the Ministry of Justice building was heavily damaged (red arrow), as was the Khusriwiye Mosque (green arrow). The Carlton Citadel Hotel (blue arrow) was completely destroyed. By 10 August 2014, the Khusriwiye Mosque had been almost completely demolished (green arrow), the Grand Serail was heavily damaged (orange arrow) and the dome of the Hammam Yalbougha an-Nasry was destroyed (purple arrow). 



 - Processing of photogrammetric models








